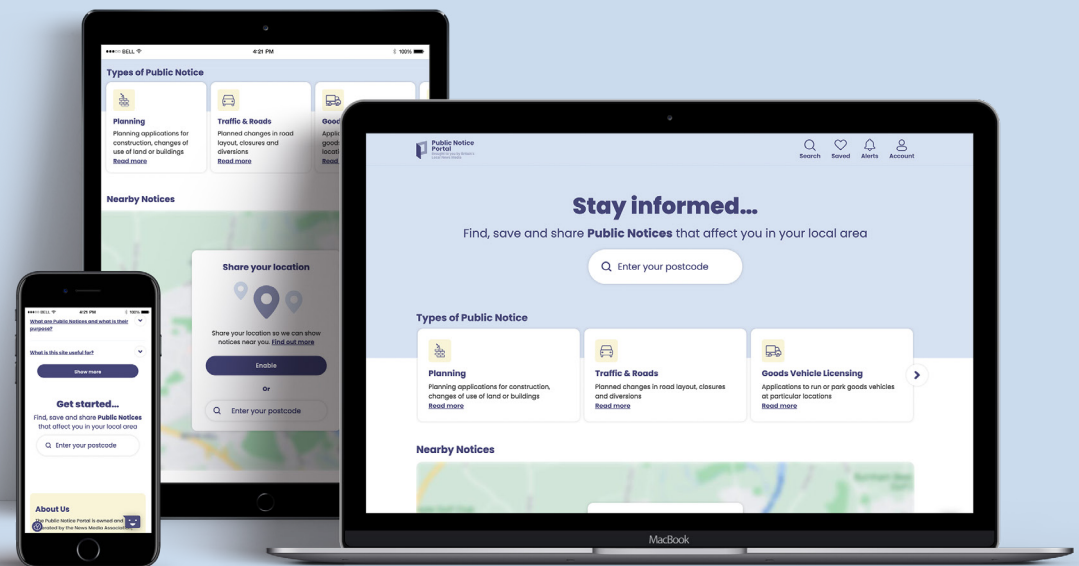

Traffic & Roads



Traffic management orders are used to make people aware of proposed changes affecting roads in their neighbourhood. These typically inform the public about temporary or permanent changes in road layout, design, closures and diversions.

- **Introducing yellow lines or other parking restrictions**
- **The addition or removal of parking bays**
- **Changing the speed limit or turning streets into one-way only**
- **Installing speed bumps**
- **Road Closures**
- **Temporary Prohibition of Traffic**
- **Stopping up Order (The term 'stopping up' means that once such an order is made, the highway land ceases to be a highway, road or footpath ie the highway rights are extinguished in law.)**



Goods Vehicle Licensing

Under the Goods Vehicles (Licensing of Operators) Act 1995 anybody driving or operating a vehicle weighing more than 3.5 tonnes and used for trade or business purposes must apply for a special licence. People need an operator's licence even if they only use the vehicle for a one-off purpose. Examples of the kind of vehicles requiring a licence include buses, coaches or goods lorries.

Legally required notices of varying purpose that don't typically fit within one of the other aforementioned notice categories.

Alcohol & Licensing

Any individuals or businesses who want to supply alcohol, run temporary events or carry out certain other licensable activities, such as playing music or serving hot food, must have been granted a licence to do so in advance. These notices are primarily required by The Licencing Act 2003. The alcohol licence requirements apply whether applicants are operating a pub, takeaway or shop or simply want to provide alcohol at a village hall.

Planning



Planning notices show details of planned developments in your neighbourhood. For example the intent to build or modify a building, or to change its use or function.

Probate & Trustee

These notices are there to announce the death of an individual and inform people when a deceased person's estate is being distributed to beneficiaries, according to the Trustees Act of 1925.

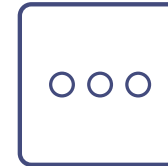

Contract & Tender

These are notices that provide general public awareness of contracts and tenders and also allow individuals, organisations and businesses the chance to put themselves forward for consideration for a particular open contract or tender. Contracts and tenders can cover a wide variety of topics e.g., ranging from the installation and maintenance of new playground equipment or park facilities through to computer and software provision, insurance services and pest control.

Other

Notices that are not required by law, but are provided on a discretionary public information basis.
